# Judit Moldovan Memorial Chemistry Teaching Assistant Awards

Each year, the UBCO Chemistry Department presents the Judit Moldovan Memorial Chemistry Teaching Assistant Awards, consisting of a certificate and a \$500 prize, to the most deserving Graduate Chemistry TA and Undergraduate Chemistry TA. The awardees are chosen for their teaching excellence, leadership, enthusiasm in their role as a TA, and service to both the Chemistry Department and their fellow students.

Judit Moldovan was the UBCO Chemistry Laboratory Manager from 2005 to 2011. The Moldovan Memorial TA awards were established by Judit's children to honor her memory and her love of the sciences and her teaching assistants. **2021 Graduate Student recipient: Riley Petillion.** Riley played an instrumental role in developing content for C203/204 labs for on-line delivery. He filmed and edited most of the labs for use as the cornerstone of our on-line curriculum. In addition he created self-marked on-line pre-lab quizzes and pre-lab procedure tests as the pre-lab assignments for each lab (which helped reduce hours spent marking by TAs). When he actively taught, he mixed using the videos with real-time live streaming to help us develop best practices for teaching labs on-line. He received very positive feedback from his students about how he made the labs more engaging and a positive environment for learning. He continuously seeks to improve the lab experience for students, through his own research, and actively applies this to his teaching.

**2021 Undergraduate student recipient: Rebecca Chadney.** Rebecca not only taught double assignments of I<sup>st</sup> year Chem labs this past year, but also volunteered to build curriculum for our on-line labs. This included creating videos on how to use excel to build graphs, developing quizzes for labs based on external resource assignments, and preparing of TA powerpoint guides for use in replacement of the TA board note talks we would normally give for in-person labs. She was very focused on improving the learning experience for students, in her own sections as well across the entire student body of 1st year Chem. She routinely actively shared possible improvements we could make during TA meetings and in discussions with staff (such as increased content in our TA guides, ways she handled student office hours, marking guides, etc.). We have adopted many of these improvements as best practices in our continued on-line instruction.

## **Chemistry Food Shack**

UBC Okanagan is a food desert and students in our laboratories have suffered. For the past 2 months, my students Vanessa White and Allison Leam have been piloting a "snack shack" program in the FIPKE lunch room and it's received positive responses from many other students. We started the program providing simple snacks (chips, bars, cup noodles, pizza pockets) and are now considering to expand the menu with more food options (e.g. frozen sandwich, pizza, soup, etc.).

This is an honour system, run by student, self-sustainable, and non-profit. We aim to keep the cost of food = purchase price from grocery stores (individual items cost \$ 0.2–2.5). With this, we hope no students will need to make compromise between work and food. And we're now ready to open the system to everyone (lab student + staff + faculty) who has access to the FIPKE lunch room. Please tell your lab members about it:

#### June: National Indigenous History Month

In light of the recent confirmation of the burial site of 215 children at the former Kamloops Indian Residential School, UBC President Santa Ono has released a statement which includes:

"Our thoughts are with the families, the communities, residential school survivors and all who mourn. We have lowered our flags on both campuses for 215 hours, until sundown on Sunday June 6, in shared grief and to pay our respects to the children of the Kamloops Residential School, their families and communities.

... If you need support, services are available: through the First Nations Longhouse, and counselling services on both the UBC Vancouver and Okanagan campuses.

... Tomorrow marks the beginning of National Indigenous History Month, when we celebrate the history, heritage and diversity of First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples in Canada. For UBC in particular, that means celebrating the history of the Musqueam and Syilx peoples on whose traditional and unceded territories the main UBC campuses have the privilege to be situated. As last week's news reminds us though, that history includes tragedy and sorrow as well as achievement and pride."
